A few comments from the editor

Internet Search for Bingham

If you do an Internet search using just the word “Bingham,” the entry at the top of the list for the last many years has been [Bingham McCutchen | Legal Insight Business Instinct](#). The company has offices in New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Boston, London, Hong Kong, Tokyo, Washington D.C. , and others. It is one of the largest law firms in the United States employing over 500 lawyers. Being curious about the “Bingham” in the company name, I did a bit of research and surprisingly learned that the name belonged to a descendant of Thomas of Connecticut. His name was Norman Williams Bingham and he traced his descent through Samuel, son of Thomas. Although we had an entry for Norman in our 1996 book, you will want to read his updated bio sketch below in Generation Eight under 1.9a.2.3.1a.9.1b.2.

Erastus Problem Solved

We inherited an Erastus problem from TAB when he assigned two families to Erastus (1.9a.3.5a.10.), son of Jedidiah and Elizabeth Webb Bingham. We continued this problem in one of the Updates. To complicate the issue, we had another Erastus (1.2.8a.1b.2.), son of Jonathan, Jr., and Elizabeth Warner Bingham, who we had not completely worked up, and two other unidentified Erastuses. Now, thanks to mega search engines and someone who entered comments on a website, we have correctly identified Erastus 1.9a.3.5a.10., and have a new biosketch of him in Generation Five, following. Also, in Generation Five, we have revised information for Erastus 1.2.8a.1b.2., AND in Generation Six, a new entry for the son of this Erastus, also named Erastus.

Erastus, Jonathan's fourth child and second by his second wife, Elizabeth Warner, was born in Mansfield, Tolland, CT in 1767, but during his childhood lived in Lebanon and Cornish, NH. His own mother, Elizabeth Warner, died when he was young.

Erastus would have been 23 years old in 1790 when the first U S census was taken, but does not appear on the census because he was not head of household. There were no Bingham on the 1790 census in Sharon, Windsor, VT.

When he was thirty-one years old Erastus married Anna Hall of Sharon, Windsor, VT and the couple lived there when their first child, Oliver, was born 4 Jan 1799.^{®59} The 1800 census credits them with a second child, a female under ten. That child was Betsey Warner, whose birth was recorded as 10 November 1800. Note that census taking for the 1800 census began on 4 August 1800 with 9 months allowed for completion. The first family would have been recorded on Aug 4, 1800 and the last on May 4, 1801.^{®1200}

That same year Erastus settled along Wyalusing Creek in then Luzerne County PA, near Rush, Susquehanna County, PA, where he was enumerated on the Pennsylvania septennial census.^{®192} He either bought his land from the Connecticut-Delaware Land Company, or he squatted. In May 1801, Henry Drinker of Philadelphia, who owned the land, listed Erastus among the supposed intruders.^{®114: 24} Drinker's goal was to sell the tracts to the intruders, not evict them.

Erastus did not remain in Pennsylvania, but gave up his land along with many of his neighbors and moved to the Holland Land Purchase in New York. Although he did not appear on the 1810 census for either Pennsylvania or New York, we know he arrived in Holland, then Niagara County, New York soon after 1813.^{®1203} Niagara had been formed from Genesee County in 1808 and Genesee from Ontario in 1802.

In 1817 Erastus was listed as the original purchaser of Lot 7, Twp 8, Range 6 in the township of Holland within the Holland Purchase.^{®1201} He was also enumerated there on the 1820 census. His household consisted of 1 male born 1810-1820, 1 male born 1795-1804, 1 male born before 1775; 1 female born 1805-1810, 2 females born 1795-1804, 1 female born before 1775.^{®113: 191} Son Oliver was born 1799, son Erastus, Jr. born 1802, daughter Betsey, born 1800. Erastus and Anna were both born before 1775. The number of people in the household, 7 instead of 5, and ages do not all fit the information we have from other sources.

The year after the 1820 census, the western portion of Niagara County, including Holland, became part of Erie County. A few years later, in 1827, part of the town of Holland became Colden. Therefore, the 1830 census shows Erastus living in Colden, Erie County, New York. His surname was spelled Bingham. His household had 5 members: 1 male 15-19, 1 male 20-29, 1 male 60-69; 1 female 20-29, 1 female 50-59.^{®1202} These seem to fit the ages of Erastus, Anna, Oliver, Betsey, and Erastus, Jr.

Erastus remained in Colden and served as a town supervisor 1831-32. ^{®1203} From then on he does not appear on the NY U.S. census and we lose track of him.

Erastus married Lydia Adams in Lisbon, CT on 24 December 1821. At first they lived in Windham where their oldest child, Samuel Bishop, was born. We have not found birth records for their next two children, but by 1829 they were living in Norwich, New London County, CT where their fourth child was born and died. Soon, however, they left Norwich.

In a letter to earlier Bingham researchers, Erastus, himself, said that he moved west in 1832. Lydia's brother, Nathaniel Bishop Adams also moved west in 1832. Nathaniel's first stop was Seneca County, Ohio, but in 1836 he moved to Defiance, Ohio where Lydia's brother-in-law, N. F. Emmons and wife, Nancy Carpenter lived. Exactly where in Ohio Erastus and Lydia first lived is unknown, but their fifth and last child, Harriet Adams, was born in Ohio in January 1835. In 1839 a Cincinnati advertising directory listed Erastus of Conn living on the corner of Mound and 5th, occupation drayman.^{®1196; ®1197} The same year, oldest son Samuel, died. Erastus should be enumerated on the 1840 census for Cincinnati. Erastus, Lydia, and Harriet moved again

before 1850 to Newport, Campbell County Kentucky, across the Ohio River from Cincinnati. Lydia died in 1851. Before 1860, Erastus went to live with son Lucius, a lawyer, in Vernon, Jennings County, Indiana, but Lucius died in December 1860 leaving Erastus on his own. He found work as a gardener with the George R. McIlroy family in nearby Campbell, Jennings County where he was in 1870. Roll 329, pg.15 A date and place of death is needed.

Considering birth dates, this Augustus is most likely the twin of Wheelock and the son of Augustus Wheelock Bingham. According to reference 608, Augustus was born 12 May 1783 in Lebanon, CT, although federal census records consistently give his birth place as VT. As adults, the earliest records for both Wheelock and twin Augustus are from NY.

In 1809, when he would have been 26, Augustus bought from William Cady, two lots in the town of Sodus, then Ontario County. He was then considered a resident of Farmington. The deed was recorded in 1827 four years after Wayne County was formed from Ontario. The next year, 1810, Augustus appeared on the federal census, presumably age 26-44, with another male age 16-25, and a female age 16-25 who was his wife, Amy. They had just been married.

Likewise, in 1820, Augustus and family lived in Farmington, Ontario County. The census accounts for his two boys and two girls born to that time and includes another male 10-16. As Augustus was a Blacksmith, this male could have been an apprentice or a relative.

In 1830, 1840, and 1850, Augustus were enumerated in Palmyra, Wayne County. Wayne was formed in 1823 from part of Ontario. Since no deeds exist to indicate that Augustus and Amy had moved to another house, we may presume that the enumeration district borders had changed. Palmyra is only ten or so miles northeast of Farmington.

The town of Palmyra was an old town, created in January 1789. The first settler was John Swift. He built the first grist mill, organized the first militia training, and donated land for the first church, the first schoolhouse, and the first burial ground. Consequently, the town was first known as Swift or Swift's Landing. However, the town name soon changed to Tolland and then in 1797 to Palmyra.

Ads in the *Wayne Democratic Press* tell us that in 1856 Richard Garton, a young English immigrant had joined Augustus Bingham in the Blacksmith business. Garton first appeared in a U.S. census in 1860 living in a boarding house with occupation Blacksmith. Augustus had died in August 1859 and wife Amy had moved in with their daughter Nancy Jackway in Palmyra.

It is probable that this Erastus Bingham born 1802, Vermont, is the son of Erastus born 1767.

The earliest record we find for Erastus Jr. comes from the Holland Land Purchase records in which an Erastus Jr. is recorded as an original purchaser in 1834 of Lot 8, Twp 8, Range 6 @1201, 1: 537 Lot 8 was the second lot north of his father Erastus' Lot 6 in the same township and range. A study of county land records is needed to learn what happened to both of these tracts.

Erastus next appears as “grocer, over creek” in the 1836 Buffalo City Directory and in 1837 his location is given as commercial [street] bel[ow] main [street]. @1204

We next find Erastus, Jr. in Chester, Wabash, Indiana where he was enumerated head of household in 1840. The household consisted of 1 male under 5, 1 male 20-29; 1 male 30-39, 1 male 40-49; 1 female 30-39. @1205 Erastus, Jr. would have been thirty-eight and he might have been married to Abigail who was born in New York, but she would have been twenty-four in 1840. One of the other males may have been the Hosea Bingham who is said to have come with Erastus. @1206 All we know of Hosea is that he purchased 160 acres of U.S. land at the Fort Wayne land office in Grant County in 1838. At the time he was of Wabash County. @1207

Erastus settled in Liberty Mills, a small community located on the east bank of the Eel River in Chester township. He opened what was probably the second store in town in 1842. Weesner, in his *History of Wabash County, Indiana*, records that Erastus was county treasurer, 1846-50, and that upon the incorporation of the town of Wabash in 1849 was elected a supervisor. @937, p. 166. In 1850 Erastus was a charter member of the IOOF Ebronah Encampment. @937, p. 363.

Erastus had definitely married by then and had a family of three girls all born in Indiana. The family also had five male boarders, four were millwrights, one a laborer. @1208

Like so many others, Erastus succumbed to Gold Fever. Thanks to Joyce Joy of the North Manchester Historical Society, Wabash County, we know that Erastus took his family to California in 1852. A friend who also went at the same time wrote home to his wife in 1853 telling her that Erastus “is fat and hearty, works hard and is industrious, talks of going into the mountains in a week.” The friend, Henry Lantz, built and owned the first hotel in North Manchester, and he also had a store at the hotel. Lantz did not prosper seeking gold and went home broke in 1855. @1211

Erastus did well enough to stay and settled down in Visalia, Tulare County, CA. He was enumerated there in 1860, age 58, with wife Abigail, 46, and two of the three daughters, Alice, 16, and Arvilla, 11. @1209 Ada, the oldest daughter had married in April, before the census was taken.

Erastus died five years later, August 1865. His grave in Visalia Public Cemetery, Section A, Block 21, Lot 30, S/W is unmarked. @1210

Huldah and John lived in Concord, NH. John was a carriage maker from Windsor, NS, CAN. In the 1880s Huldah became a member of the Plymouth Brethren Church, an independent church in Concord started by Rev J.P. Nutting, a former Baptist minister. @1167 After Huldah died in 1891, son Charles T. became head of household, but continued to live at home with his father, and his father's new wife, Susan.

Charles Brown was 23 years old when he married Abigail Tice in 1834. Like his father, Charles was a blacksmith. In 1840 he and coowner H. Armington had a Palmyra, NY Main Street blacksmith business. @1239 Charles and Abby had no children of their own, but about 1860, they took on the care of two of Charles' brother, George Alanson's children: Amy and Mahlon age 5 and 1, respectively. @83

George became a well-known business man in Palmyra, expanding his blacksmith work to general mechanics and dealing in real estate. One of his land transactions was the sale of a lot in Sodus which could have been for his father (see Deed Book 38: 27 Online Family Search image 326). Unfortunately, Charles died when only 59, in 1870, leaving wife Abby, 57, and Amy and Mahlon, 15 and 11, respectively. In Abby's petition for administration of Charles' estate, she stated there were no children meaning that Charles and Abby had not adopted the children. By 1880, Mahlon was living with his mother, Alice.

After Charles died, Abigail went to work as a domestic. In 1875 she lived with the Lewis B. Allen family in Palmyra. @1282

Mary was the first of Augustus' children to marry. She was 21 in 1834, when she married Alanson Todd. By 1840 they had three children, a boy and two girls. Before 1849, they moved to Flint, Genesee, Michigan where they were enumerated on the 1850 census. 1276 Alanson died the next year, 1851, age 39. Mary and family returned to live in Palmyra where they also buried Alanson. 682 The 1860 census tells us that Mary and daughter Helen worked as seamstresses and Mary Todd's civil war pension application packet tells us that son Charles worked at a grist mill to help support the family. 1278 Nephew Millard, age 4, son of brother George Alanson, lived with the family. 1275

Son Charles Augustus enlisted in the army in 1862 when he was 20 years old. He was a private in Company A of the 111th New York Infantry when the muster roll records that he deserted 28 August 1863. 1277 However, that is not the whole story. He had returned home to Palmyra for as long as six months, then returned to his regiment, was tried and honorably acquitted about February 1864. He remained with his company for about three months. Then on 22 June 1864 he was recorded as missing in action near Petersburg, VA. For the August and Oct muster rolls, he was simply "absent," but the truth came on the December muster roll when he was recorded "prisoner of war." The same muster roll ascribes a death date of 1 January 1865 at Andersonville, GA, but that is not accurate. He had been sent from Andersonville to Florence, South Carolina in November 1864. While there he became ill and died 7 December 1864. 1278 That explains why his name is not included in any online death list of Andersonville prisoners. As a widow and mother in financial need, Mary was awarded a pension of \$8.00 a month. 1278

Morgan was 27 when he married Lydia Tice in 1842. If the US Census information is correct, their daughter, Lydia, was born two years before their marriage. Morgan managed to elude the census takers in 1850, consequently his whereabouts then remains unknown. Wife Lydia Ann was head of household, daughter Lydia age 10. With them lived Harvey Tice, clerk, age 24, presumably Lydia's brother. 1280 Morgan had probably gone west to Coloma, El Dorado County, California during the gold rush. A collection of letters written by Jared Comstock Brown, mentioning Morgan L. Bingham is in the California State Library. Brown was also born in Wayne County, New York and the letters were addressed to his father, Charles Brown. 1281

By 1855, Morgan was back at home in Palmyra, working as a blacksmith. 1283 Thereafter, we can document his residency in Palmyra in 1860, 1861, and 1865, but his desire to go west, again, took over and we find him on the EL Dorado County, California voter registration list in 1867. 1279 Home again in 1870, Morgan worked as a sewing machine agent, but in 1875 he was simply farming and living in the town of Macedon. That was too tame for him, so again he went west, this time to mine silver in Colorado. He died there, in Lake City, Hinsdale County in 1878. 1230, 1245

Like all his brothers, George was brought up in the blacksmith business. The youngest in the family, he was twenty years younger than his oldest brother. He married in 1853 when 22 years old and he, wife Alice M, and daughter Amy lived with his parents in 1855. 1283 George and Amy had three more children before he walked out. George is not included in the 1860 census, but his wife and children are. Wife Alice had given two of the children, Harriet A. and Millard F., to her mother to care for while she took a job as a live-in domestic with the Marvin Hill family. The other two children, Amy and Mahlon, lived with George's oldest brother Charles B. and his wife, Abigail. 83

George reappeared at Niagara Falls in 12 May 1861 to enlist in the army. He was sent to Albany for official enlistment as a commissioned officer at the rank of ensign (2nd Lieutenant) in Company I, 28th Regiment on 22 May 1861. The New York State record states July 4, 1861 as his commissioning date with rank from May 14.

The 28th regiment, called the "Niagara Rifles," was composed of five companies from Niagara County, two from Orleans, one from Ontario, one from Genesee, and one from Sullivan, and was mustered into the U. S. service for two years on May 22, 1861 at Albany. A month was spent in camp at Camp Morgan and on June 25, the regiment left the state for Washington, D.C. It was assigned on July 7 to Butterfield's brigade, Keim's division of Gen. Patterson's force, which it joined at Martinsburg, W. Va. Camp was occupied at Berlin until August 20, when the force moved to Darnestown and remained there until October 20, when it was ordered to Ball's bluff, but did not arrive in time to take part in the battle. From December 5, 1861, to January 6, 1862, the regiment encamped at Fredericksburg. 1284 On January 30, by special orders of Major General McClellan, George's resignation was accepted and he was honorably discharged. 1301 His pension file indicates that the reason was lack of moral character - the men did not agree with his beliefs and morale within the unit was suffering. MRL

George did not return home. Where he went is unknown. Research indicates that a woman named Rose (Lehman) Bingham applied for a widow's pension in 1890. The soldier's name was George A. Bingham. Although his rank was recorded as Private, Company and Regiment matched. This George had lived in New Jersey and fathered two sons, Charles M. and John Jacob. Both are searchable. Research on George Alanson Bingham continues.

By 1875, Alice had married Martin Groff and moved to Auburn, New York. Daughter Harriet lived with them. Son Mahlon joined them before 1880.

Norman Williams Bingham, Jr. left his name on one of the largest legal firms in the United States - until recently "Bingham McCutchen", but now, simply "Bingham." Initially, Norman displayed great ambivalence about his career path. Both athletics and journalism attracted him. As an undergraduate at Harvard he was a star quarter-miler and captain of his track team, but he also founded the Harvard Bulletin and was a senior editor on the Harvard Crimson.

After graduating Harvard in 1895, Norman later wrote that he played "with the idea that I would like to become a newspaper man. During the summer months of 1895 I worked on the Boston Journal. The short experience demonstrated to my satisfaction that I had neither the facility in writing nor the temperament important to success in journalism." He returned to Cambridge, entered law school and "never ... regretted that I did so."

During his years at law school he became graduate manager of athletics for Harvard to help pay for his education. He had written and published in 1895 a book titled *The Book of Athletics And Out-of-Door Sports*. This book is still available from used book stores and online at archive.org.

Norman formed his own law firm in 1905 after working for the law firm of Carver & Blodgett from 1898. He took with him associates Fitz-Henry Smith, Jr. and Donald M. Hill, forming Bingham, Smith & Hill. From there a combination of good health,

legal smarts, and perseverance contributed to his surname of Bingham surviving in the names of successor law firms and culminating in the name Bingham McCutchen. Read on to learn how this played out.

Two years after starting, the firm of Carver & Blodgett ended their partnership and both men created new firms: Carver, Wardner & Goodwin, and Blodgett, Jones & Burnham. Blodgett's firm eventually recognized that "the pressures of clients' work and the increasing recognition of the firm required some adjustments," and in 1913, that firm merged with Bingham's to form Blodgett, Jones, Burnham & Bingham. In 1926 Blodgett passed away, Jones departed the firm, and two more associates were made partner, thereby changing the name to Burnham, Bingham, Gould & Murphy. Soon thereafter, the firm lost two more partners and a few associates as well. The changing circumstances of the firm plus the Depression nudged it in a new direction in 1933 when they merged with Pillsbury, Dana, Young & Moulton to form Burnham, Bingham, Pillsbury, Dana & Gould. The new firm was only four years old when poor health caused Addison C. Burnham to retire as a partner and become 'of counsel' in 1937. and Samuel Pillsbury to retire completely. On November 1, 1937, the firm name was shortened to Bingham Dana & Gould and remained that for forty years although Norman Bingham had died in 1958. In 1997, the firm's name was shortened to Bingham Dana, and in 2002, as part of its merger with McCutchen, Doyle, Brown & Enersen, the name was changed to Bingham McCutchen. In 2007 the firm went through an extensive "rebranding" process and decided to adopt the logo of "Bingham" (although the firm's official name is still Bingham McCutchen). Its website is www.bingham.com.^{®1148}

Norman W. Bingham Jr.'s office was at 1 U.S. Street, Boston; his home in West Newton. His various activities, including President of the Boston Bar Association, made him sufficiently prominent to be included in Who Was Who in America.^{®210, 3: 76} Old files of valuable information about the early years of each law firm were destroyed to make space for newer files so much history has been lost, nevertheless David Grayson Allen wrote a 1991 book titled *Bingham Dana & Gould: A Centennial History*. Much of the above material comes from that book.

We know little of Norman's family. Wife Ethel graduated Smith College in 1901. Three daughters, all but Elizabeth, followed in her footsteps and graduated from Smith College.^{®1147}

George Wayne went by the name of Wayne on some official records. During his childhood he lived in Burdette, Hand County, South Dakota. (1900, 1910, 1920 census). When 23, he married Elizabeth Knoblauch in Benson, Swift, Minnesota. She was 18. They returned to Burdette, SD to live and work, but sons Vincent and Arden were born in nearby Tulare, Spink, SD in 1926 and 1930, respectively.

Elizabeth then had an affair with George Harbac, Jr., who had been living in Burdette, also. George Harbac, Jr., had already fathered two children by different women and had spent some time in the Illinois State Penitentiary. Elizabeth's affair with him resulted in a pregnancy and George Wayne Bingham divorced her. She took their two boys to Candor, Tioga County, New York where George Harbac, Jr.'s parents lived and where she gave birth to George Dwight Harbac. George Dwight carried the surname Harbac until he changed it to Bingham when he was 18.^{®1227}

George Wayne Bingham moved to Lee, Franklin County, SD where he continued to work as a hired farm hand.^{®1228}

Shortly after 1935 Elizabeth and her three boys moved to Craig, Colorado using the surname Harbac and where George Harbac, Jr., also lived, but they did not live together. By 1940 Elizabeth and George Harbac, Jr. had gone their separate ways. Elizabeth eventually moved to Buffalo, WY where she married Leo Charlie Geibler in 1954. They later divorced and Elizabeth married Joe Hillard, but when Hillard died in 1978, Elizabeth married Geibler again.

George Wayne Bingham remarried in 1942, Josephine Nachazel. They made their home with her father on a farm east of Popejoy, Franklin County, Iowa.

When Wheelock Hayward Bingham retired in 1966 he was president of Macy's (R.H. Macy & Co., Inc.). Before that, he had been president of Macy's New York division, the first non-family member of the owning Straus family to earn that distinction.

In his forty years of working for Macy's, Wheelock built a national reputation as a merchant and industry spokesman. A genial, round-faced stocky man, he presented a calm exterior, but his actions were forceful and aggressive. He did so well as a Harvard College Freshman working in a summer job at Macy's in 1926 that he was hired full time and never returned to Harvard.®1162 He did, however, leave Macy's for a few years to serve in the Navy during WW II.

On leave of absence from Macy's in 1943 he entered the Navy as a Supply Corp lieutenant. Soon promoted, at age 36 he became the youngest captain in the Navy during World War II. He made his major contribution as head of the 1945 committee recommending that all land based naval retail activities be operated like a large chain of retail stores and a central office be established to oversee the operation of the Navy Resale System. Put into effect April 1, 1946 the system continues today under the name NEXCOM.®1161

Returning to civilian life, Macy's named him president of their newly acquired store in San Francisco - O'Connor, Moffat & Co. The store later became Macy's California. Wheelock brought with him a group of ex-navy colleagues skilled as organizers. In seven years they took sales from 8 million to 23 million dollars making Macy's the second most profitable store in the city. One of their techniques was to out advertise the competition.

After taking charge of the New York City store in 1952, Wheelock stated in an interview that he expected to run an aggressive store and to develop successful merchandising personnel. He also criticized the local newspapers for frequent advertising rate increases, while suggesting they devote more space to advertising.

In 1956 Wheelock became president and chief operating officer of Macy's corporation sharing the top management with Jack I. Straus, chairman and chief executive officer. During his long career, Wheelock also served as a director on several boards and commissions including the Bank of America and the New York Convention and Visitor Bureau.

Divorced from his first wife and remarried, Wheelock contributed two children to the Bingham lineage.

He was then attached to the U.S. Military Government, Berlin Sector, and served July 1, 1945 - Sept 1, 1949 in Information Services as Editor in Chief of Die Neue Zeitung (Berlin).®1150

Enno remained in Berlin to become Time Magazine's Bureau Chief. His family lived with him in Europe for a few years between 1949 and 1952. Daughter Margaret was born in France in 1951. The regiment eventually was sent to Hawaii for garrison duty where it stayed until January 1944. It was then moved to Guadalcanal and on to New Britain for active duty patrolling one end of the island where Japanese were bottled up.

Finally, in 1945, the regiment participated in real fighting. They were the reserve for the XIV Corps during the initial landings at Lingayen Gulf, Philippines. After intense fighting near Ft. Stotsenburg, Tarlac, and Clark Field, the Regiment was relieved by the 43rd Division. The Regiment left Luzon on 8 March 1945 and landed on Leyte on the 13th of the same month. On 10 May 1945, the Regiment assaulted Macjalar Bay on the Island of Mindanao. They advanced 85 miles, before hooking up with the 31st Division. During this time the Regiment was also attached to the Eighth Army Area Command and then X Corps. During the 108ths' time on Leyte, 2nd Battalion (with attachments) was assigned the duty of destroying Japanese forces on the Island of Masbate. After the Entire Regiment reformed on Leyte, they continued their push on to Mindanao.

Before the Regiment went on to Korea, Lewis was demobilized at the rank of 1st Sgt. Returning home he apparently became a civilian employee of the Auburn armory and worked there until the building was vacated for demolition in 1958. @1304, 1305, 1306

When they were very young boys in 1936 Carleton Dille and his brother Lou Alvin traveled alone by train from Washington D.C. to San Diego, California.
