### **Death of the Bingham Association President**

In April, The Bingham Association lost long time president Arthur Walker Bingham, III. Walker single handedly kept The Bingham Association alive after his father, Arthur Walker, Jr., died in 1967. The sole surviving officer of The Bingham Association, Arthur, Jr., had been treasurer for 40 years. Walker took over as treasurer and president. He enlisted new volunteers to fill the offices and handled all correspondence. By 1973 Walker was convinced that the 1927-1930 three volume *The Bingham Family In The United States* needed a complete reworking. He contributed in many ways to this project which culminated in the publication of the *The Bingham Family In The United States, The Descendants of Thomas Bingham of Connecticut* in 1996. All Bingham and all related to Bingham should extend a thank you Walker.

Following is Walker's obituary from the New York Times, 5 April 2016.

#### **Bingham, Arthur Walker III**

died peacefully at home on April 1, 2016, in his 88th year. He was born in New York City and attended The Buckley School, St. Paul's School, Harvard College and Harvard Law School. He served as a naval officer during the Korean War and held the rank of Lieutenant. After graduating Law School, he was an attorney at Millbank Tweed, Hadley & McCloy, the General Attorney for Abex Corporation, and the Chairman of Boorum & Pease Company. He led an active life participating in many organizations including, at various times, President of the Church Club of New York, Trustee of Fort Ticonderoga, Commander of Knights Templar, Master of Holland Lodge, a Vestryman of St. James Church, Secretary of the National Institute of Social Sciences, and a Lieutenant Governor of the Society of Colonial Wars. He was passionate about history and collected a library of antique medicinal advertising, Patent Medicines and preparations, about which he published the "Snake Oil Syndrome," an illustrated history of Patent Medicine advertising. He is survived by his beloved wife, Nicolette Pathy, his daughter Nicole P. Bingham, his sons Arthur W. Bingham and Alexander D. Bingham, and three grandchildren. A funeral service celebrating his life will be held at the Church of the Epiphany, 1393 York Avenue, New York City, on April 18th at 4pm. In lieu of flowers, contributions in his honor may be made to St. Paul's School, 325 Pleasant Street, Concord, NH or The Buckley School, 113 East 73rd Street, NYC.

How wrong I was - and how thankful I am to all of those thirteen folks who came forward to make this Update as full and as long as it is. You'll find their names and where they live entered near the end of this Update just before the sources. Their initials should be attached to the entries they contributed. Not to shy any one of them, I am paying special tribute to the two, Eric Stover and Carl Bingham, who submitted complete entries and sources in the same format as the book. They saved me tremendous time and I knew we all could rely upon their research and bio sketches with the sources they used and submitted. My thank you to Eric and Carl and to all the rest of you thirteen.

### **Public Records of the Living**

In this issue I bring a few lines almost up to date. I say almost because some folks don't want to share information about the living. That attitude simply makes it more difficult for future generations. Would it not have been more helpful and enlightening if our parents and grandparents had left a road map backwards for us? My philosophy is that all public records should be shared. Since census records have a 70 year curtain, it is very difficult to gain information about people born after that time unless the individual gives it freely. Researchers should not be afraid to ask the living for permission to share all information that has been recorded on a public record: birth, marriage, children, divorce, deeds, etc.

Still, it is possible to dig out some information using various internet sources. A good place to start is with family trees that are online. Look at more than one tree for that family, especially those with several source citations. Eliminate the copy artists, detect the primary, and verify the sources, yourself. That process may well lead you to newer or overlooked sources such as Legacy.com for recent obituaries. Those obits often state the living descendants. Then try to locate those descendants using one of the people search websites. Often you will find an address and phone number. If you're part of that line, give a call!

### **Numbering Error**

Please note a numbering error and make the correction as follows: The five children of Joseph 1.10a.2b.4. and Sally Stevens need an "a" after the 4.

Renumber Geheil's children (6-46) by adding an a after the 6. Thus 1.2.8b.3.1.6.1. etc becomes 1.2.8b.3.1.6a.1. etc.

### **Citing the Big Red Bingham Book**

Sadly to relate, our Bingham Book, *The Descendants of Thomas Bingham etc.* is now twenty years old! Much information that we needed to reap from court house searches and butt-sticking hours at a film reader is now online. This creates different ways for referencing the same sources. It also gives us a chance to find sources that were too difficult to obtain for one reason or another. **It does not, however, change the information contained in the book nor eliminate the need to properly cite the book.** Let me be totally direct: I am finding Bingham researchers who are failing to cite the book as a source. **As long as the book is in copyright, no part may be reproduced without proper citation.** Whenever a researcher duplicates material that is in the book, whether it is online or on paper, the book must be cited as a source. Worldcat.org offers five different citation styles for every book that OCLC has catalogued. You should familiarize yourself with worldcat.org and how to find the citation options. If you find a breach of copyright, please document the exact incident and email the information to me.

### **Citing Political Jurisdiction**

One of the biggest problems researchers face is using the correct political jurisdiction for the date discussed. Pennsylvania is a perfect example. As people settled farther and farther west, new counties were carved out of existing counties. A person who settled on the West side of the Susquehanna River before 1749, lived in Lancaster County. A person who died on the same farm in 1775, died in York County. Both counties will hold records for that person.

An example in this UPDATE, is Cortland County, New York. The grandparents of Horace 1.10a.2b.2.1.3. settled in Solon Township, Onondaga County, New York in 1794 (the deed was recorded in Cayuga County). When the grandfather died in 1843, on the same farm, he died in Solon Township, Cortland County. Cortland County had been carved from Onondaga County in 1808.

Twenty-one years later, 1829, Cortlandville Township was formed due west of Solon Township. Cortlandville Township had four settlements that became villages. One village was Cortland, another was McGrawville. All villages in the township of Cortlandville, had a Cortlandville address as far as the U.S. Post Office was concerned. That means a resident of McGrawville would officially have a Cortlandville address. This is the same today. What complicates the situation is that in 1900, the village of Cortland became a city. Cities are superior to townships and have their own political jurisdiction. So after 1900 the City of Cortland was surrounded by the Township of Cortlandville. The other villages in Cortlandville Township, such as McGraw still have Cortlandville street addresses. That is 39 West Main Street, McGraw, is also 39 West Main Street, Cortlandville.

### **Descendants of Female Bingham**

Genealogical custom is to follow the surname. Thus genealogies follow the male line, but include females only as long as the birth surname is retained. When females take a married name, they become members of that surname group. The Bingham book, however, does name the children of married females.

If both male and female lines were to be included in one family history as long and as large as the Bingham family, several volumes would be needed and users would find it quite confusing. We have long talked about a separate volume devoted to female Bingham, without answering the question, where do we stop - how many generations do we cover?

Frequently, I am saddened by the need to tell contributors that I cannot include them in *The Bingham Family in the United States* because their mothers, grandmothers, great grandmothers, etc., not their fathers, were Bingham. So, until someone steps forward with a plan for a book about Bingham women, I will simply suggest that the solution lies in tracing your own female line backwards.

### **Source Citations in this UPDATE**

If there seems to be more source citations in this UPDATE than usual, you are correct, there are. We are trying something new. We are giving a new number that is specific to the entry to each source even it has been used once or many times before. Ancestry has introduced this practice and I agree that it is more user friendly than searching back through a long list of sources.

However, I most definitely do not agree with the citation format that Ancestry uses. Thus, I have changed the format for most sources to reflect the latest scholarly trend. That is, because so many sources are available on the Internet, it is unnecessary to include location, date accessed, minor details, unless the source is not on the Internet.

James was a Baptist minister and a farmer. He grew up in Cortland Co., NY where his family had settled before he was thirteen. By the time he was twenty-four, he was married to Sarah Horton who was five years younger than he. Since their first child was born in IL before 24 July 1842, James and Sarah probably moved there from NY soon after their marriage. They lived in Waukegan, Newport Twp. Lake Co IL through 1853.<sup>®92</sup> In 1854 they moved to Washington Twp., Winneshiek Co. IA, in or near Ft. Atkinson.<sup>®83</sup> The 1860 census indicates all eight children ranging in age from 2-18 were living at home. They were still there in 1870.<sup>®173</sup> Sons William E. and Theron also lived in Winneshiek Co. in 1870. The 1870 census shows Serepta, Frank and Emma still living at home. An 1880 agricultural production census shows James as owning 158 acres of land in Washington Township. The 1880 census shows Emma still living at home.

## Generation Six

David, also called David P. in records from his later life, was a woolen manufacturer. Born in Gilsun, Cheshire, New Hampshire, he, along with his parents and siblings, are included in Silvanus Hayward's genealogical information in the *History of the Town Of Gilsun New Hampshire 1881*, although the family left Gilsun about 1816 and moved to Granville, Washington County, New York.

Hayward noted that David "went West," married Harriet B. Chase of Bloomington, Ind. and had four children, but gave no further information. So far, we cannot verify this aspect of David's life, but early Bingham researchers did identify the supposed four children, all girls.<sup>®1</sup> After studying the oldest girl, Cynthia Ann, of Granville, Washington County New York, we believe that she and her sisters are more likely the children of Armenia Granger, the probable female with whom David was living in Granville in 1830.<sup>®1727</sup>

Since David was not old enough to have been enumerated on the 1820 U.S. Census, the 1830 record is the earliest census for him. He would have been 27 years old. For that year, the only David Bingham recorded on the federal census lived in Granville, Washington County, New York with a female, age 15 - 19.<sup>®1727</sup> They had no children. Since that female was too young to have had four children she is most likely not Harriet B. Chase, but Armena Granger, the mother of David's six children.

The 1840 U.S. Census makes the mystery of David's wives more complicated. In that year five men named David Bingham appeared on the federal census. They were David (1.1.9.10.10.) in Grass Lake, Jackson, MI with 6 persons; David in New York City, Ward 11 with 10 persons; David in Chester, Hampden, MA with 5 persons; David H. (Daniel Havens 1.10.2a.4a.7a.1.) in Tuscaloosa, AL with 21 persons 15 of whom were slaves; and David P. in Baltimore, Windsor, VT with 6 persons.<sup>®1836</sup> We can eliminate two of the Davids as not being the David we are searching because we already have identified them. Of the three Davids remaining, the David P. living in Baltimore, Windsor County, Vermont is probably the David we are searching. First, we know from his Almshouse Admission Record that David P. was born in Gilsun, Cheshire, NH, second, David P. and family lived next door to the Chester Granger we believe to have been Armena's father, third, the ages of David and Chester seem to fit and four, both men are engaged in manufacturing and trade which seems consistent with later records. What makes this neat arrangement iffy is the middle initial "P" in David's name. This is the first time a middle initial appears. While that is not unusual, other researchers have jumped on that tidbit of information to give David the middle name of Philamon and either confuse him with his younger brother, Philarmon, who settled and died in Canada, or to make the brothers one person. Neither option is correct.

[NOTE: 1840 - David P. Bingham and Chester Granger lived next door in Baltimore, Windsor, VT. David P. had two boys and two girls: 1 male under 5, 1 male 5-9, 1 male 30-39, 1 female under 5, 1 female 5-9, 1 female 20-29, 1 employed in man and trade. Chester Granger had two boys and one girl: 2 males 10-14. 1 male 40-49, 1 female 15-19, 1 female 40-49, 3 employed in many and trade]

David and Armena may have had six children as reported by Hayward and accepted by early Bingham researchers.<sup>®1</sup> David, himself, when age 74 in 1877 and admitted to the Warren County Almshouse, declared that he had four living children.<sup>®1802</sup> Perhaps we need to attribute the names of the six children we have to Armenia Granger and that is how we will handle the issue here. In other words, we have no evidence that David and a Harriet B. Chase were married, but we do have enough information about some of the children to send us in the direction of attributing them to Armena Granger, at least until proven otherwise.

If Armena was the female living with David in 1830 age 15-19, she would have been born between 1811 and 1815. This data fits with entries in the elusive Chester and Elizabeth Granger Bible, once in the hands of Mrs. Roscoe Granger, Hudson Falls, NY and referred to on rootsweb.ancestry.com. The Bible's location is currently unknown. Armena is listed as the second born child, June 24, 1813. Her death date, November 28, 1847 is also recorded. Beyond that we have found no records, no marriage, no burial.

Concerning the birth dates of the children, they are only as accurate as census and marriage records provide or our calculating indicates.

Between 1850 and 1880, David did a good job in eluding U.S. Census takers. During that period the only census we can find him on is the 1855 New York State Census. He appears as David P. living with Betsey in Chester, Warren County. His birth place was recorded as Vermont and his occupation as clock tinker.®1729

Twenty-two years later, in 1877, David was admitted to the Warren County Almshouse. The 1880 U.S. Census does record him living in the Almshouse, born in New Hampshire and occupation "manufacturer work." David lived in the Almshouse in Warrensburg for the next eight years. He was discharged 5 October 1885. Unable to work, David was readmitted 19 October 1885. That is the last recorded date we have for him, so far.®1802

Calvin Clark worked as a mechanic and carpenter until he was about 30 years old or perhaps until after his second wife, Rebecca Angeline, died in 1854. She was his first cousin, the youngest daughter of uncle Lemuel (1.2.3.7.9.). In 1850, they lived in Cheshire Co. NH with his six year old surviving daughter by his first wife. ®92: 360 Switching to dentistry, in 1857 Calvin married his third wife, Mary Astle. He was then a practicing dentist in Fitchburg, MA.®1898 By 1860 he had obtained a job as "Surgeon Dentist" in Chesterfield, Essex County, New York where he lived with wife, Mary, their 8 month old son, Albert, and his daughter Marthietta by his first wife. The family soon moved to Glens Falls, Warren County, New York where they lived in 1863 when Calvin registered for the Civil War draft.®1785 Not staying in one place for long, Calvin and family lived in Queensbury, Warren County in 1865.®1798 According to Hayward's History of Gilsom, New Hampshire, Calvin practiced dentistry for ten years and then began practicing medicine in 1868.®42 The U.S. Census, however, tells us that Calvin and family moved to Philadelphia where he worked in shoe manufacturing and where his daughter was born in 1869.®1895 Further research is needed to learn if Calvin was also studying medicine at one of the several Philadelphia medical schools. Hayward also tells us that Calvin desired a better understanding of the theory of medicine so he attended the American Health College in Ohio.®42 That school operated 1874-1888. Located in Cincinnati, that particular medical college was classified as fraudulent in 1918 by the Council on Medical Education and Hospitals.®1896 Calvin would have attended the American Health College in its first year, 1874, since he was practicing dentistry in Brooklyn, NY in 1875.®1358, ®1804 However, in 1876 he was listed as a physician in Brooklyn and continued practicing medicine there through at least 1885.®1358 In 1888 and 1889 the U.S. City Directories for Kansas City, Missouri show him there as a physician. At the same time, New York death records show that Calvin C. Bingham died in New York in June 1889 and was buried in Green-Wood Cemetery. Third wife Mary Astle had died in 1877 in Brooklyn.®1900 Calvin married fourth wife, Mary J. Slocum before 1880.®1903 After Calvin died she moved to Erie, Pennsylvania to live with her brother George Slocum. She was 81 when she died in Erie in 1929.®682

Frank was the eighth of nine children and was listed in James' household in both the 1860 and 1870 census, the latter as a farm laborer in the house of his father. There is a Frank Bingham from Ft. Atkinson listed in the freshman Engineering class at Iowa State University in 1878®1854. In 1880 he is listed in Jackson Twp, IA as a farm laborer in the house of Marcellus S. Merrill (to be his father-in-law two years later.) Frank married Kate Merrill, whose family later were early settlers in Steamboat Springs, CO.®1855 At the time they were married Frank was a theology student in Morgan Park, IL, presumably at the Baptist Union Theological Seminary. Sometime after they were married, the couple moved to Nebraska, where their first children were born, with Carl born in Plainview in 1888, and Guy born in Stella in 1891. Frank was a Baptist minister. Whether he was a minister in the aforementioned cities in Nebraska is not known. Frank was listed as a pastor at the First Baptist Church in Hiawatha, KS from 20 Sept 1896 – 1 June 1900.®1856 He is listed as living in Kansas City, KS in the 1905 local census, with Kate and all four children.®1857 The 1910 Census shows him living in Okmulgee, OK with Kate and Myrtle and employed as a pastor. His grandson Harold visited him on his farm near Mead, NE around 1913. After his passing, funeral services were held at Marietta (NE)

Baptist Church on 10 Sept 1917. His grave can be found at Green Mound Cemetery surrounded by corn and soybean fields, off the paved road up on a hill. Only a quarter mile from the cemetery is an old house which had been converted from a Baptist Church @1858, which could have been Frank and Kate's church. Less than two years later, Kate would be buried next to Frank in the same cemetery.

Joseph, 22, and his younger brother, Ozias, 20, went to California by ship around the Horn in 1852.@1633 For about three years after they arrived, they mined for gold in Yuba and Sierra counties.@1616 Joseph then settled near Oakland in Alameda County and began work as a wheelright. In 1860 at age 30, he lived in Brooklyn Township adjoining Oakland, was married to Tabitha F, age 22, and had a three year old daughter, Mary.@1624 His other four children were all born in the 1860s.@1619

Before 1863 Joseph moved to Solano County where brother Ozias lived. Ozias was instrumental in forming Maine Prairie Township in 1863 and both he and Joseph were Privates in the Maine Prairie Rifles, a national guard unit formed to support the Union cause. The unit was headquartered in the community of Binghamton named to honor Ozias.@1618 The brothers also were members of the Lodge of Good Templars founded at Binghamton in 1863. In 1869 both Joseph and Ozias received patents from the federal government for their 160 acre homestead claims in Range 1-E, Township 6-N, Section 24, that is, in Binghamton and Maine Prairie Township.@1617

Joseph, Tabitha and family of four children - George had died in 1868 - lived only five doors from Ozias (called Henry on the 1870 census) in 1870. Joseph claimed a farm value of \$10,000.@1619 The author of the bio sketch of Ozias in *The Memorial and Biographical History of the Counties of Fresno, Tulare and Kern, California. Chicago: Lewis Pub. Co., 1892, pp. 611-612* states that Joseph died in Westminster, Los Angeles, CA. According to Caroline Chavez, Caroline Family Tree (Ancestry.com), Joseph and his wife separated and his voter registration was transferred from Solano to Wilmington, Los Angeles County in 1872.@1665 He worked as a mechanic.@1631 While Joseph might have lived in Wilmington for a short while, his voter registration was ultimately transferred to Westminster for according to the original Westminster Colony Annals, Joseph arrived at Westminster in 1872 from Compton, CA.@1666 Westminster was founded as a Presbyterian community and is located next to Garden Grove where Joseph was buried in Magnolia Memorial Park. Brother Ozias was an active member of the Presbyterian Church and it is likely that Joseph was, also.@1628

After Joseph's death Tabitha and children moved to Lakeport, Lake County where they lived in 1880.@172: T737-3 Daughter Mary, married to Jacob Jenne had moved to Los Angeles. Still widowed in 1900, Tabitha lived with unmarried son Charles in Kelseyville, Lake County.@258: T1034-16 In 1910 Tabitha lived with her widowed daughter Sarah in Lakeport and died there in 1913.@1664

Joseph is another male Bingham who daughtered out. Although he had three boys and two girls, none of the boys had children. According to a biographical sketch in the *Memorial and Biographical History of the Counties of Fresno, Tulare, and Kern*, Ozias came to CA when he was about 20 years old with his older brother, Joseph.@1616 This statement is corroborated in Carpenter and Millberry's 1914 *History of Mendocino and Lake counties, California* which states that Joseph and his younger brother, Ozias, came to California by ship around The Horn in 1852.@1633 In 1850, Ozias still lived in New Hampshire, but not at home.

He was working as a tanner for Jabez Thompson in Newport, Sullivan County. 1668 For 1850, Joseph's whereabouts are unknown as he seems to have skipped the census taker.

After the brothers arrived in California, they apparently mined for gold in Yuba and Sierra counties for about three years. Ozias told his biographer that they were some of the first to use hydraulic mining equipment. He stated that the most they averaged a day was \$10 and that on only one claim which was worked out in a few weeks. 1616 Tiring of gold mining, the brothers went separate ways.

Ozias found a job in Bolinas, Marin County working as a laborer for an M. Jerome, dairyman. 1669 He also continued sporadic mining adventures. 1625

By 1863, the brothers had come together again in the community of Maine Prairie part of an unincorporated area in Solano County. Citizens there supported the Union cause during the Civil War and in 1862 organized a military company calling themselves the "Maine Prairie Rifles." Under the laws of California, they registered as a company of the State Militia under the same name on September 19, 1863, with 72 men enrolled. Although they had Springfield rifles, they had no armory. Under Ozias's guidance they bought a 2 acre lot northwest of Maine Prairie for a new, one story armory. The construction of the armory prompted the start of the community of Binghamton named after Ozias who was responsible for forming Binghamton and Maine Prairie Township in August 1863. 1629

Ozias married in 1864, Josephine Williams of Petaluma, a native of Iowa who had come to California with her family in 1853 when she was twelve years old. In 1869 Ozias and Joseph each took up homestead claims on 160 acres in Rangee 1-E, Township 6 N, Ozias on SE Sec 24 and Joseph on SW Sec 24. 1617 Josephine and Ozias erected buildings and made other improvements on their homestead. The 1870 U. S. Census under Henry and Josephine Bingham shows them living in Binghamton and Maine Prairie Township with three residents between them and Joseph and his family. 1619 About 1871, second cousin, Jonathan Lovejoy Bingham (1.10a.4b.9b.2.), came to visit and seek relief from tuberculosis, but instead, died there. 8HAM

Soon after that Ozias and Josephine sold out and moved to Vacaville. For about six years they worked on developing a beautiful farm and vineyards then moved south of San Francisco Bay, living first in San Jose, Santa Clara County in 1877, then Stockton, San Joaquin County in 1880. 1670 Ozias sold real estate in San Jose and worked in soap manufacturing in Stockton. 1620 Next, they lived in Modesto, Stanislaus County, but in 1886 settled in Tulare County, even farther south in California. After living in Traver, Tulare County, until 1890, they bought a 20 acre raisin vineyard in Dinuba that might have been part of the 80 acres they homesteaded in 1890. 1623, 1616

Ozias died before 1900. Josephine was recorded as widowed in the U.S. Census of that year. She, and her mother lived with Ella H. and John M. Taylor and family in Santa Cruz. 1622

Cynthia's residence at the time of her marriage in 1849 was Granville, Washington County, NY, but her marriage was recorded in Stamford, Bennington, Vermont about 70 miles distant. 1788 The 1900 federal census tells us that she was born in February 1830. 1894 The oldest of David and Armenia's children, Cynthia married George Gideon Libby. He was about twenty-four and had been born in Maine to one of many Libby families. 1797

Cynthia and George lived in Washington County, NY in 1860. They had three children and George was a shoemaker, but they had moved around. About 1856 they had lived in Saratoga County where Frank was born and about 1858 they lived in Albany County where Harry was born. 1797, 1798 Business must have been better in Troy, Rensselaer County as the family, with six children, lived there in 1865. 1798

By 1870 George G. and sons George E. and Frank D. all worked in the boot making industry in Worcester, Massachusetts. They remained there until 1876 when the Worcester City Directory recorded them as removed to New York. In 1877 they actually lived in East Newark, New Jersey, but in 1879 they lived in Brooklyn. 1358

As the boot industry slowed and the Libby men aged, they switched occupation. All three were carpenters in Brooklyn in 1891. George G. then disappeared from the city directory and died before 1900. 1358 Cynthia Ann, with three children still alive, moved in with son George E. who remained in Brooklyn through 1900. 1894 When his children were on their own George and wife Adeline moved to Hempstead, Nassau, NY where they lived in 1910. Cynthia Ann, 75, moved in with daughter Alma and grandson George Albert Bingham in Brooklyn where she lived in 1905. 1906

Ira Francis began adult life aboard a whaling ship. First as a "Greenhand" on the whaling bark *President II* departing Westport, Bristol, Massachusetts, May 1849 when he was seventeen. After whaling in the Atlantic, the ship returned August 1850 with 703 barrels of sperm oil and 45 barrels of baleen oil.<sup>®1701, 1720</sup> Promoted to "Boatsteerer," Ira signed on to the bark *Globe* and departed the next month, September 1850. The ship sailed to the Indian Ocean. Gone for four and one half years, the *Globe* returned January 1855 with 250 barrels of sperm oil, 650 barrels of baleen oil, and 11,341 pounds whale bone.<sup>®1701, 1720</sup>

Ira married two and a half years later in 1858. By 1860 he was living with wife and year old daughter in Rensselaer County, NY and working as a shoemaker.<sup>®1697, 1358</sup> Apparently, Ira was not a shoemaker for long. The letter his wife wrote to a Bingham researcher in 1870 stated that Ira had been a seaman until 1866. This statement becomes more believable since we find no Civil War military record for Ira. His wife said that in 1866 they settled in the Williamsburg section of Brooklyn and Ira became a shoe salesman. However, the Albany City Directory for 1863 lists Ira F. Bingham as a salesman and "Sarah A. boots and shoes" both at 36 South Pearl.<sup>®1358</sup> Furthermore, the New York State Census shows the family living in Brooklyn, Kings County, NY in 1865.<sup>®1707</sup> The Brooklyn City Directories for 1867, 1868, and 1869 show Ira living on N. 1st street; in 1867 at 381, in 1868 and 1869 at 156.

The next year, 1870, Ira died of a hemorrhage, of which sort we do not know.<sup>®1219</sup> Sarah and the children continued to live in Brooklyn, but his daughter married very young and his three sons became juvenile delinquents. For more details see their entries in Generation Eight.

Laura married George P. Twiss about 1860. They lived in Johnsbury, Warren County, New York. Laura's age on the 1860 census was recorded as 18.<sup>®1780</sup> Years later, her marriage certificate to Joseph Bruno stated that she was born in 1844 so contradicts this age by two years.<sup>®1739</sup> Laura's birth date given above as 23 April 1843 was calculated from her age at death which was 67 years 1 month 14 days. Husband George Twiss was recorded as 33 years old in 1860 with the occupation of farm laborer. Suffice it to say, he was quite a bit older than Laura.<sup>®1780</sup>

Laura and George moved to the town of Caldwell, Warren County, NY shortly after their marriage. By 1865 they had three children.<sup>®1781</sup> The family is not recorded on the 1870 census. In 1880 they lived in Thurman, Warren County, and had nine children. George worked as a farm laborer.<sup>®1782</sup> By the time George died in 1901 his children were adults between the ages of 22 and 40 and Laura Ann was only 57.

George had written his will in 1895. He named his wife, Laura Twiss, sole heir and executrix.<sup>®1841</sup> It was not until 1904, however, that the will was proved and letters of administration were granted to Laura, now Laura Combs married to Warren L. Combs of Johnsbury, Warren County.<sup>®1842, 1843</sup> They married about 1902. An unverified date for Warren Combs death is 5 January 1905, age 74.

Laura then apparently married John Bruno. The New York State Census for 1905 shows her living as wife with John Bruno, age 73, but no marriage record has been found, yet. John had had at least eleven children by wife Mary Andrus.<sup>®1845</sup> He lived with Laura for three and a half years before dying in December 1908.

Laura Ann then married Joseph R. Bruno, September 2 or 13, 1909. Joseph had just divorced Jennie McGann leaving him with three young children.<sup>®1887</sup> His job as cook in the hotel left him little time to care for the children and Laura Ann needed a roof over her head.<sup>®1739, 1844</sup> Laura was sixty-six, Joseph was about fifty years old.<sup>®1740</sup> The arrangement lasted for less than a year. Laura Ann died in June 1910.

Although Albert was born in Massachusetts in 1859, by the time he was 8 months old his parents had moved to Chesterfield, Essex County, NY on the West side of Lake Champlain from Burlington, Vermont. His father, Calvin Clark Bingham, had found a position there as dentist. Half sister Marthietta, 21, daughter of his father's first wife, Syrena Loveland, lived with them.@1800 Albert lived in upper New York until about 1863. His family then moved south to Warren County and on to Philadelphia where Albert appeared on the 1870 federal census.@1895 Before 1875, he moved again with his family to Brooklyn, Kings, New York where father Calvin became a practicing dentist and physician.

In Brooklyn, Albert would have met his cousin Alma Julia Libby. They had a common ancestor in John Bingham Jr. (1.2.3.7.) making them 2C1R, otherwise called 4th cousins. They were about the same age although Albert was a third generation descendant of John Jr., and Alma Julia was a fourth generation descendant. They married 14 February 1879 in Brooklyn. In 1880 they lived in New York City. Albert was a gateman for the railroad and George Albert was 1 month old.@1799

Albert apparently died before 1886 when Alma married 2nd Frank Westerdaho. Alma and Frank lived in Brooklyn in 1900, but by 1905 Alma was a widow living with son George A. Bingham. Alma's mother, Cynthia Ann, lived with George A., also.@1904

Mary is difficult to research because her name appears in several different forms and there is no agreement on the spelling of her middle name. As a five year old and a fourteen year old she is Mary, but as a 23 year old she is Dalavia.@1497, @1498, @1499 Various combinations of Mrs. Mary DeLavia/Delava Atkins continue after her marriage age 25 in 1872. On the New York State Census for 1875 she is Delava living in Cortland with husband Albert H. Atkins who was a dry goods merchant.@1475 Before that, Albert had been farming in McGrawville and in 1880 that is where they lived and Albert worked as a grocer.@1476

Before 1900 Albert became an undertaker. Mary's name is now Mary, and Mary's mother Rosetta lived with them in Cortlandville where they owned their home outright.@1477 Rosetta died in 1903. Now Mary D., she and Albert remained on E. Main Street. For several years, she and sister Estella Bingham Holland battled each other over a right of way suit. See the Cortland newspapers for details. After forty years of marriage, but no children, Mary died in 1912. Albert lived another six years dying from an illness so serious that doctors declined to operate.@1483

Estella married Palmer B. Holland in 1879. In lieu of a marriage record, two other facts from the U. S. census must be considered together to give us this year. The 1880 census tells us that their unnamed son was born in April 1880 (named Harry L. he died in 1881).@1484, @1450 The 1900 census tells us they had been married twenty years. @1486 Subtracting the twenty years from

1900, we may think that 1880 was the marriage year, however, since census taking was begun June 1, subtracting the twenty from 1 June 1900 takes us to 1 June 1879 and allows for the five or six months in 1879 when Estella would have been pregnant to allow for an April 1880 baby. The family lived in Cortlandville where Palmer was a harness maker.<sup>1484</sup> By 1900 Palmer had turned to farming on his own property, but also operated his harness shop.<sup>1450</sup> Estella died in 1907. Palmer remained on his property until he died in 1919.<sup>1487, 1488, 1450</sup>

Charles undoubtedly took over the farm after father Horace died in 1888. Before that, from the time he was married, Charles and his family lived first in Homer Township 1870, then Cortlandville Township 1880.<sup>1453, 1454</sup> In 1889, a year after father Horace died, Charles and family lived in McGrawville, a village in Cortland County close to the Solon Township line.<sup>668</sup> By 1892 they lived in Solon Township and brother Willard lived with them.<sup>1415</sup> For the previous 12 years or more, at least since 1880, Charles had worked as a farmer. Now that he was living in Solon, he could report in 1900 that he owned his farm, although it was mortgaged.<sup>1415</sup> The next year, in 1901, the Cortland Democrat newspaper reported: "Charles E. Bingham has his new house about completed, and it is one of the finest in the town. Wesley Crysler was the builder."<sup>1456</sup> That same year, Charles's son Ernest married Wesley Crysler's daughter Dena.<sup>1510, 1516</sup>

The area along Maybury Brook where many of the Cortland County Bingham lived was mainly dairy farming. Charles had 25 milkers on his farm which he owned outright by 1910.<sup>1409, 1458</sup> As he approached age 65, Charles advertised his farm at auction in November 1916, cows, equipment, and all.<sup>1539</sup> Whatever happened with the auction, he still owned his own farm in 1920 and 1925.<sup>1459, 1460</sup> Apparently the farm did not sell so he leased it. In 1929 the farm was rented to the Winslow family.<sup>1541</sup> But in 1930, he and Ida were not farming, nor living in their own house in Solon Township, but renting a house in McGrawville!<sup>1461</sup> Perhaps they had deeded the farm to son Ernest who, in 1930, lived in Solon Township and owned his own farm. Charles died in 1934 and Ida, a little over a year later in 1935.

Myron was married three times. First he married H. Adell Brown at her parent's home in 1876 when he was twenty-two years old.<sup>890</sup> The couple lived with her parents on their farm in Cortlandville in 1880.<sup>1425</sup> However, by 1889 they were not living together as evidenced by Myron boarding at 110 S. Main Street, Cortlandville, with no wife named. His occupation was then that of wire worker.<sup>667</sup> Myron soon moved to Pennsylvania for six months or more, long enough to obtain a Pennsylvania divorce in 1891.<sup>1418</sup> Later in her life, H. Adell lived and worked with Lucia M. Sherwood. They operated a private home and boarding house for small children and also advertised themselves as horse trainers.<sup>1409</sup> When she died in 1927 she was still living with Miss Lucia Sherwood, but added was a John Sherwood.<sup>1424</sup>

Myron married a second time in 1891 or 1892. According to the New York State Census he and Etta lived in Cortland next door to Glenn and Orah Bingham.<sup>1420</sup> Glenn was Myron's youngest brother. In 1897, Myron decided to divorce Etta and began proceedings against her. Because his first divorce was a one sided Pennsylvania divorce, the case went before the New York Supreme Court and eventually the Court decided in his favor in 1899.<sup>1418</sup>

The following year, 1900, the US Census shows Myron working as a servant for his eighty-four year old first cousin twice removed Sarah (1.10a.2b.4a.4.) Bingham Kelsey. She had a farm in Cortlandville.<sup>1402</sup>

Myron married for the third time in 1904, widow Charlotte Barton Zimmer. Charlotte had a sixteen year old daughter, Ina Mae, by Alfred Zimmer. They were from Binghamton, Broome, NY and in 1904 lived at 107 Main Street, Binghamton.<sup>1358</sup> The child, Ina Zimmer, in 1892, age 4, lived with Andrew F. and Martha Barton, her mother's parents, in Oswego, Tioga County while her mother, Lottie Barton Zimmer lived and worked in Newark, Tioga County for hotel keeper Orrian Dimmoch.<sup>1416, 1415</sup>

After his marriage to Charlotte, Myron (spelled Miron in the census) and she lived in Union, Broome County and he worked as a carpenter.<sup>1419</sup> Ina remained in Binghamton as she had a job at the Binghamton State Hospital. By 1910 Myron and Lottie had

moved to Cortlandville where they lived on a mortgaged farm. Ina Mae was recorded as living with them, but that was not accurate as she was still working at the state hospital in Binghamton.®1403

Myron died 28 Apr 1915. Charlotte filed his will on 3 May 1915. Myron left everything he had to her.®112 Charlotte returned to Binghamton where, in 1920, she lived with daughter Ina and her husband Leon M. Randall. Charlotte worked as a practical nurse.®1421 Charlotte continued to live in Binghamton until her death.®1422, ®1423

Willard lived with brother Charles after father Horace died in 1888.®1415 In 1892, age twenty-eight, he married Mary C. Welke giving her naturalized citizenship.®1573 She had arrived in the United States with her parents from Germany in 1873 at ten months of age.®1571. Willard and Mary owned a mortgaged dairy farm in Solon Township along the same road as brothers Charles E. and Glenn. Willard and Glenn each milked 12 cows, but Charles E. milked 25.®1358

By 1905 Willard and Mary had three children, Ione L., Harley P., and Caroline.®1566 In 1910 Mary's father moved in with them after Mary's mother, Rose, died.®1567 In 1920 all three children still live at home.®1569

In 1925, the family was recorded as living at 39 West Main Street, McGraw. Caroline, age 22, worked for V.C. Co. as a corset maker. Ione and Harley had left home. Willard, as W.J. was still farming and Mary's father, Leo was 88 years old.®1570 Shortly after, Willard went to work for Wickwire Brothers in the city of Cortland as a carpenter. Wickwire produced nails, wire, screen cloth, and other metal and wire products.

Mary died unexpectedly in April, 1927 following surgery for gallstones.®1585 Willard remained with Wickwire until he moved to Marathon, Freetown Township to live with Harley in 1933 and 1934. He lived with Harley for fifteen more years before dying in 1950 age 85.®1442, ®1443

They had no children.

For most of his working years, Ambrose Horace Bingham was a self-employed mason. He grew up in Solon, then shared a double house in Cortlandville with inlaws before settling down in McGraw, Cortland County, NY.®1364, ®1368, ®930, ®1365, ®1366 After their seven children were grown, wife Lula went to work as a machine operator in a corset factory.®1367 She and Albrose celebrated their golden wedding anniversary in 1951 when Lula was 71 and Albrose was 73.®1391 *NOTE: See children in Generation Eight for correct numbering*

The family moved back to Kansas City in 1917, where Carl landed a job as a freight claim agent with the Kansas City Southern Railroad until July 1927. He was then employed by the Jenkins Music Co. Though a member of the Independence Avenue Baptist Church, Carl was

also an organist with the Presbyterian Church. The family then moved to Chicago, but after he found his partner to be unethical in his business practice, he returned to Kansas City in 1928 without a job. In 1928 Carl got a job with Buick Motor Co. in Chillicothe, MO, then back with the Kansas City Southern RR. In 1930, after the stock market crash, Carl landed a job with Missouri Motors Distributing Corp., ultimately becoming Vice President. In 1936 Carl became VP of Adams Transfer and Storage Co. When his boss enlisted in the service for WWII, Carl became the chief officer, a position which he held until his death in 1945. Not only was Carl able to keep his family together during the depression, he sent all three sons to college. He had a severe heart condition since his early teens. Bertha moved to Greenville, SC to live out her last days with her youngest son Robert, his wife Opha and family.

Guy was born in Stella, NE, and moved with the family around Nebraska and into Kansas, including Kansas City, KS. He married Verna in Kansas City, MO, with his father Rev. Frank officiating. He lived in Harrison, AR with his wife and first child in 1917. At the time, he was working with the Missouri and North Arkansas Railroad. Guy moved to Rockford, IL around 1917 and started one of the early photo finishing shops, Rockford Photo Service. He also started one of the first mail-in developing services. He was organizer of the Master Photo Finishers of America, serving as the executive secretary for many years: Passenger lists for 1932, 1938, and 1947 show Guy arriving from Southampton, England, parts of the Caribbean and Brazil, and Puerto Rico, respectively.®1865, 1866, 1867 Cruise lines would employ him to take motion pictures of life on a cruise ship and lecture about it around the country. He died early of heart problems, similar to his older brother Carl. Verna raised two girls and lived to a ripe old age of 102, dying 47 years after Guy. The 1940 census shows Verna, age 23, working as a stenographer, and Katherine, aged 20, still living with the family.

Vance was born while his father was the pastor at Hiawatha Baptist Church in Kansas. By 1910, his father had moved the family, including Vance and his sister Myrtle to Okmulgee, OK for similar position. Vance lived in Kansas City and worked as a shoe salesman in 1918 at age 18. In 1919, Vance was attending William Jewell College in Liberty, MO, listed as Supply Sergeant of the S.A.T.C.®1387 He met Dorothy at Linfield College, a Baptist college in McMinnville, OR. Vance graduated with a B.A. in Business Administration. Dorothy also attended the University of Washington in 1925, where she studied science and graduated with a B.S. in Home Economics.®1387

Vance and Dorothy's wedding, officiated by her father, Rev. F. E. Dark, was in Seattle, WA, in 1926.®1868 They lived with her family until they moved to Tampa, FL, where their first two children, Evelyn and Vance, Jr., were born. The 1930 census lists his family in Tampa FL and his occupation as manager of a wholesale lumber company. A 1930 Passenger list shows Vance arriving in Tampa from Cuba on Feb 20. They moved to Washington around 1930, as his son Lawrence was born in Shelton, WA early the following year. In 1935 he got a contract with NAPA for exclusive rights to sell auto parts in Alaska, and also with Graybar, to sell electrical appliances and supplies. He also represented 14 other companies, selling their products in Alaska. Back then, the only way to get to Alaska was by steamship. He moved his family to Ketchikan, Alaska in 1937 hoping to have more time with them, but still had to spend time every third month in Seattle updating his catalogs, which filled two ocean trunks. He moved the family back to Seattle in 1940. The 1940 census lists Vance and his family in Seattle, WA with his occupation as salesman. The story is 'he sold freezers to the Eskimos.' He saw Alaska as a prime territory to sell electrical appliances and automotive supplies. He had exclusive rights on many products in Alaska. During this period, until 1946, while living in Seattle, he would be gone 2 months, then home for one month.

He typically traveled extensively between March and November, much of it by air.<sup>1881</sup> They purchased an airplane after son Vance learned to fly at Linfield, and Vance C. and Larry learned soon thereafter. In 1949, son Larry got his float rating while working at the Anchorage store and flew his dad on some bush flights. Starting in 1946 until his death in 1954, he had opened five auto parts stores in Alaska, two in Anchorage, and one each in Juneau, Fairbanks, and Ketchikan. His sons would help out in the summers when school was out. Upon his death, his financial partners bought out the business. Dorothy, who acted as the bookkeeper for the business, based in Seattle, received the settlement. She moved to Olympia in 1955, where she was a secretary for the Olympia Baptist Church. During the years she spent in Olympia, she spent a summer serving as hostess in the dining room at the American Baptist Conference Grounds at Green Lake, WI. In 1955, she went on an American Baptist Mission Tour and attended the Baptist World Alliance in London. She then moved to San Diego to be with her sister Kathryn, and finally spent her last 20 years living with her daughter Evelyn in Long Beach, CA.<sup>1875</sup>

Mary Elvira Bingham and Jacob Martin Jenne began married life as fruit farmers in Westminster Colony in Los Angeles County where they lived immediately after their marriage. Mary's father, Joseph had settled in Westminster Colony in 1872 after short stays in Wilmington and Compton.<sup>1628</sup>, <sup>1639</sup>, [see 1.10a.4b.8.6a.3. Joseph Bingham] Westminster Colony was founded in 1869-70 as a Presbyterian settlement, but it also promoted and taught irrigation and cultivation, especially horticulture and apiculture.<sup>1628</sup>

Jacob Martin Jenne had immigrated from Baden-Wurttemberg in 1867 with his family when he was about 18 years old. In 1870 the family lived on a farm they had bought in Carlin, Calhoun County, Illinois. Several other families in the area were also from Germany. Jacob was the third child and the third of five boys.<sup>1654</sup> Jacob's father, John Martin Jenne, died in 1872 leaving all his real and personal estate to wife Mary Magdalene with right to sell and that she did.<sup>1659</sup> Some researchers say she moved the family to St. Louis. Perhaps that is where they met other German immigrants planning to move west.

However and whenever the Jennes moved west we do not know, but we do know that in 1876 they rented a farm near Coupeville, Island County, Washington Territory and that son Jacob, then 26-27, was naturalized at Port Townsend, Jefferson County, Washington Territory on 15 September 1876.<sup>1657</sup>, <sup>1660</sup> Port Townsend, across Admiralty Inlet from Coupeville, was headquarters of the Puget Sound Customs Collection District and the county court would have had the necessary tools to grant naturalization.

On their trip from St Louis to Coupeville, the Jennes would have stopped over in San Francisco. To get to Coupeville from St. Louis in the mid 1870s meant a long trip either by train to San Francisco and north along the coast by ship to Whidbey Island, or by ship to Panama, by train or donkey across the isthmus and then north along the coast by ship. If the Jennes came across Panama, their ship would have stopped at Anaheim Landing, California, a usual stop on the coast route for people heading to one of the several new settlements south of Los Angeles including Westminster Colony.<sup>1663</sup> Or the Jennes could have joined a group of Germans who temporarily stayed in San Francisco while negotiating settlement on a tract next to Westminster Colony.<sup>1628</sup> It is also possible that Mary was teaching in San Francisco and met Jacob there. Whatever the scenario, Jacob and Mary met and then married in San Francisco in February 1878, but they lived in Westminster, California where Mary's father, Joseph, lived. Joseph died in September 1878, seven months after Mary and Jacob's marriage. Mary and Jacob's first child, Frank, was born at Westminster in March 1879, and the family was recorded in Westminster on the 1880 U.S. Census.<sup>1639</sup>

The couple left Westminster Colony shortly after 1880 returning to Kelseyville, Lake County where Mary's mother lived.<sup>1661</sup> Not staying long, they moved back to southern California by 1885 and settled in Highland, San Bernardino County where they continued fruit farming. Three of their four children were born while they lived in Highland and their two youngest children, Vivian and Alvin died there. In 1896 their two surviving children, were Frank, 17, and Eldred, 11. Jacob, Mary, and the two boys moved to Coupeville.<sup>1656</sup>

The Klondike gold rush had just begun. Work in Alaska offered Jacob a chance of making real money. Before he left, Mary and he bought a farm in the developing Palouse country near Pullman, Washington. Mary and the boys could support themselves and Frank could enroll at the newly formed Washington State College. Jacob went on to Alaska where he had a job with Treadwell Mining Company.<sup>1660</sup> In 1900 he was enumerated in Douglas, Alaska and Mary, Frank and Eldred lived on their own farm in Pullman, Whitman County, WA. Frank was 21 and "At School" studying civil engineering.<sup>1640</sup>, <sup>1644</sup> He graduated by 1905. His job in 1910 was working for the city of Prosser, Benton County, as a civil engineer. He later was hired as a hydrographer by the U.S. Government Columbia Basin Reclamation Project including the building of Grand Coulee Dam in Washington.<sup>1655</sup>, <sup>1658</sup>

Jacob remained in Alaska for six years. His last year there, 1902, he worked as a customs official and 17 year old son Eldred was able to spend the summer with him before beginning college.<sup>1656</sup> Jacob returned to Washington in 1903 and used his "sub-

stantial profits” earned in Alaska to buy a 40 acre ranch near Grandview in Yakima County. He enrolled in the Washington State College Winter School for Farmers and in 1906 in the Live Stock Section located in Prosser, much closer to Grandview.®1658

At the same time Mary and Eldred were also enrolled at Washington State. Mary was studying Economics and History in preparation for her thirty year teaching career. Encouraged by Mary, Eldred had had a fascination with entomology since childhood and he was on his way to becoming an expert on all insect pests, especially the codling moth of the Yakima Valley. Eldred graduated in 1906 and went to Cornell University for a year of graduate study. Following that, he received an appointment as special agent with the Federal Bureau of Entomology. In 1908 he was promoted to Expert Agent and in 1909 sent to Georgia for research. There he contracted tuberculosis, perhaps weakened by the typhoid fever he had come down with in 1905 while doing field work in the Yakima Valley. Hoping that his TB would be manageable in a dryer climate, the Bureau assigned him to Walnut Creek, California, but he died there in 1912. His publications are available online.®1656, ®1632

In 1909 Jacob sold half of his 40 acre ranch that he bought for \$5,800 in 1905 for more than \$20,000. With the profit he bought a 20 acre farm south of Grandview where he built a “fine residence and good barns.” Eventually, he had 12 acres in apples and pears and the rest in hay and grain for his dairy business.®1660 After ten years of hard work, Jacob sold the farm. He and Mary went back to Lakeport, California where they lived with her widowed sister. Jacob at 71 was retired. Mary at 63, continued her teaching.®1645 Jacob died within two years, but Mary kept on teaching, perhaps through 1930 as the census records.®1646 [Caroline Chavez provided basic material for this sketch and for the following children of Joseph. Charles, mother, and younger siblings bought the Andrews place in Lake County in 1877 after father Joseph left. Charles had attended public school in Solano County and two years of high school in San Francisco before moving.®1633 They apparently operated a dairy farm until closer to 1893 when Charles homesteaded 160 acres in Lake County.®1634 His mother lived with him in 1900, but by 1910 had moved into Lakeport to live with daughter Sarah, and Sarah’s daughter. Charles continued to live alone the rest of his life operating his farm of twenty acres of fruit trees and the rest in cattle and hay.®1633, ®1637

Sarah lived in Lakeport, Lake County most of her life. She would have been eleven or twelve years old when father Joseph died and mother Tabitha moved the family to Lakeport, Lake County from Solano County.®1647 Sarah married in 1896, at age 30, Herbert Carpenter, 7 years younger than she.®1648 Their daughter, Marsalette, was born in 1904.®1650

The following year, 1905, the court declared Herbert insane, having had a sudden episode of constant excitement accompanied by delusions and illusions and was committed to Mendocino State Hospital. He died there 9 years later in 1914 of tuberculosis of the greater trochanter of the right femur. This disease was poorly diagnosed and reported at the time.®1652 Symptoms caused great pain and could be recurring for as long as 30 years. The cause was usually trauma. It is impossible to draw conclusions, but, perhaps, Herbert’s main disease was not mental illness. See his commitment report at ®1649.

Sarah remained in Lakeport and worked as a nurse, at least part of the time.®1024 When Marsalette was ready for college, Sarah and she moved to Berkeley where they lived together until Marsalette graduated and took a job teaching high school in Williams, Colusa County.®1653

Frank left California to become a permanent Alaskan. In 1900, age 31, he was a civilian laborer at the Southern Alaska military station working on the Trans-Alaska Military Road.®1627 By 1910 he lived in Copper Center and managed the road house at Tonsina between Valdez and Tok, with Paul F. Hansel from Germany.®1630 He was still there in 1920: we find no later records.

Harriet was only eleven years old when her father, Ira Francis, died. She lived in Brooklyn with her mother and younger siblings, but did not finish four years of high school. Instead, she married at age sixteen, Joseph Daniels.®1717 They had three children, before he died. None of the children lived.

Harriet married again when she was about twenty-three, John Day Smith. He was born in England, but lived in Brooklyn by the time he was eight. In 1880 he was a widower with two daughters, Lilly D. age 2 and Ella Emma age 4. He was a salesman of canned meat. Harriet and John had three more children between 1884 and 1895. In 1900, John's daughter, Lily, 22, still lived at home, but his daughter Ella Emma, now called Elizabeth, lived and worked elsewhere in the county. Harriet and John's three children were still at home.®1805 By 1910, Mabel, 15, was the only child still at home and niece Harriet L., James Nelson's daughter, lived with them. She was a billing clerk at the News Company.®1806

A diabetic, Harriet died in a diabetic coma when she was just sixty-one years old.

James Nelson led a troubled youth. After father Ira died in 1870, James lived at home with mother Sarah A. as the family moved almost annually from one residence to another in Brooklyn.®1358 When he was seventeen and the family lived at 157 - 6th St, Brooklyn, James and his two brothers, Henry Francis and Albert Ira were arrested and sent to the Brooklyn Truant House For Boys, also called the House of Refuge. James was tried for "Assault with Intent to Harm," sentenced 23 October 1878 to serve five years and transferred to Sing Sing Prison on the 24th. The Sing Sing Admission Register describes an unpleasant picture of James. He was 5 feet 4 inches tall, weighed 123 pounds, was cross eyed, had a large scar on this left temple, his left arm had been broken, and he had a scar on his left hip.®1807 His brothers, being younger, remained in the truant home where they were enumerated on 8 June 1880 when the census was taken.®1700

If James served his full five year term, he would have been released in 1883. So far, however, we have not found a record for him between 1878 and 1891 when he appeared as a painter in Brooklyn and was misfiled in the city directory under the Rs as Ringham. James married in the same year, 16 February 1891, Mary W. Hoefiner. Their daughter, Harriet Louisa was born in April 1893. By then, James had switched his name to Nelson J. or Nelson as per the Brooklyn City directories for 1895, 1897 and 1898. Each year he lived at a different address.

James's life ended as unhappily as his youth. On May 8, 1896 he and another man were working as house painters when their scaffolding broke. Both men were injured. James broke his leg as he fell on and killed a 4 year old boy. The accident sent James into depression. He killed himself by poisoning on September 18, 1897.®1808

James left behind wife Mary, daughter Harriet, and son Walter. The daughter, Harriet Louisa, was named after James' sister. By 1900 she lived with her grandmother Sarah and Uncle Albert in Hamilton, Madison, NY.®1731 The son, Walter John, was born after the accident, but before his father's death. When mother Mary married second, Walter Krug, in 1898 and had another child in 1900, Walter went to live permanently with grandmother Sarah Ann in Poughkeepsie.®1705

Albert Ira was less than two years old when his father died. Following the leadership of his oldest brother, James Nelson, Albert was arrested when 9 years old in 1877 and sent to the Brooklyn Truant House for Boys along with his 12 year old brother Francis. That is where they were living when the 1880 census was taken.<sup>1700</sup> According to his obituary, Albert attended and graduated from a business school in Chicago, IL. He then attended Colgate University where we find him in 1900 age 32 years old. He was studying for the ministry. His mother, Sarah Ann, was head of household and Hattie L., James Nelson's daughter, lived with them.<sup>1731</sup> Albert left Colgate after one year and moved to Poughkeepsie, NY in 1901. In 1903 he married Anna Rice in Poughkeepsie. Anna had three daughters, Florence, Adele, Laura, from her previous marriage to a Mr. Marshall. Albert and Anna's only child, Albert Frederick, was born in 1904. Albert had a job as sexton at a church which he kept through 1915.<sup>1703</sup> By 1920 he had a job as a special officer at a bank.<sup>1913</sup> In 1925 and 1930 his position was custodian at the Poughkeepsie Savings Bank.<sup>1732,1914</sup> Wife Anna died in 1931, but Albert kept on working at his janitorial job through 1940. His stepdaughter, Laura lived with him.<sup>1915</sup> He continued to work through 1946, but was retired in 1949 That means he worked until he was about 80 years old!<sup>1358</sup> He was 95 when he died.<sup>1918</sup>

In 1900, George, age 20, lived in Brooklyn, NY with mother Alma, 36, and her second husband Frank Westerdaho, 39. George's surname was erroneously spelled Brigham.<sup>1801</sup> Five years later, 1905, George, 25, worked as a carpenter, was head of household and his widowed mother, Alma, and his grandmother, Cynthia Ann, 75, lived with him.<sup>1906</sup> From then until 1942 we loose track of George. He surfaces in South Kent, Kent, Litchfield County, Connecticut only to fill out his WW II draft registration card. He was 62 and unemployed. His closest contact was a Robert J. Boyd.<sup>780</sup> Still living on 8 March 1950 he filed a social security life claim on his own behalf. As of 2016 that is all we know.

By 1930 Heil, Edith and James had moved to Denver, CO. Heil, age 62, rented for \$20.00 a month, had no radio, been married to Edith, age 55, for 25 years, and son Jim, age 17, was a filling station attendant. They lived at 1919 E 26th Avenue next to the filling station.<sup>1355</sup> As of 2015, the old filling station where James worked was still standing on the corner of 26th and High although the building was either empty or being used for storage [see maps.google.com]. The census was taken 7 April 1930, two months before Heil died.

After Heil died, Edith and James moved to Durango, LaPlata, CO to live with daughter/sister Estella and husband William Mahoney<sup>1356</sup> [See 2004-2007 UPDATE]

George was nine years old when his father died. Sent to prep school at Kingsley Manor, Morristown, NJ, his Aunt Rhea Augusta took care of him financially. From high school, he entered the U. S. Navy and served during WW I as a Yeoman 3rd Class according to his burial record at Long Island National Cemetery.<sup>682</sup> After the war, George entered Rutgers College in

1920 where he majored in Mechanical and Electrical Engineering. After graduation he lived in New Jersey where he had many different jobs with major corporations such as Remington Rand. As an example, in 1930 he was an industrial engineer and employer in a paint production factory.®1329

George had two families: two children with Anita Browne and two children with Elizabeth Lame. Elizabeth Lame did secretarial work with several large corporations including Schering Plough (Merck), Ingersoll Rand, and the National State Bank of Westfield, NJ. She worked until she was 71 years old. Twenty-six year later at age 97 in 2015 she was alive and well. Elizabeth and George married seven years before he divorced Anita Browne, although his children with Anita were grown before his children with Elizabeth Lame were born. Elizabeth divorced George in 1955. The next year, in 1956, Elizabeth Lame married Harrison Barnes. Although Barnes did not adopt Elizabeth's children, their surname was legally changed to Barnes in 1963.®1320

When World War Two was about to begin, Russell and Cora bought a dairy farm on Austin Ridge Rd in Norwood, St Lawrence County, NY near where Russell had grown up.<sup>®1580</sup> For the next 20 years, until his sudden death in 1961, Russell and Caroline owned and operated the farm, but not as a dairy farm. In 1946 they discontinued dairying due to lack of help and auctioned off their herd of 51 Holstein Dairy Cattle.<sup>®1589</sup> Russell became active as a Teamster's union steward working on behalf of other dairy farmers.<sup>®1590</sup> After Russell's death, Caroline continued to live in Norwood.<sup>®1574</sup>

Marvin was the middle brother of the family and also graduated from Central College in Fayette, MO around 1939. He married Virginia in 1942. He was in the Army in WWII from 1942 to the spring of 1946. Marvin served as an intelligence officer in both theaters of the war: (a) European Theater under General Eisenhower in North Africa and off the coast Italy from 1943 to the spring of 1944; (b) the Pacific Theater on General Douglas MacArthur's staff from 1944 to the spring of 1946. While in the Philippines he helped write the first Constitution for the Republic of the Philippines, and retained the original signing document.@1871 He was then sent to Japan in August prior to the signing of the peace documents ending WWII on the Battleship Missouri, 2 September 1945, to make certain it was safe for Gen. MacArthur to do so. He continued to serve on Gen. MacArthur's staff in Japan until he was discharged as a Captain from active duty in the spring of 1946. He returned to Ginny in Kansas City and was introduced to his first born child, who was then in his 13th month. He continued to serve in the Army as a reserve officer and retired as a Lieutenant Colonel. This required two weeks of summer duty until he retired in the 1970s. Marvin worked for Dun and Bradstreet for 42 years. While in Kansas City he served as a reporter and then as a regional manager for several states. They moved from Prairie Village, KS in 1951 after the Kansas City floods to Buffalo, NY with their three boys, where he was a regional manager. After that, he purchased a Ready-mix concrete, sand and gravel company in Camas, WA. Selling the company in 1970, he finally was able to pursue his interest in flying. With the GI Bill, he was able to acquire licenses in airplanes, land and sea, helicopters and gliders with commercial and airline pilot ratings, plus was a flight instructor for 42 years. In 1970 he started with Hillsboro Aviation in Hillsboro, OR. as sales manager for the Piper aircraft line and the Great Lakes aerobatic sports biplane.

Larry once flew cross-country in the open cockpit Great Lakes biplane with Peggy. He was delivering one to a fellow in Massachusetts. The plane had a 26-gallon fuel tank and could only fly about 200 miles at a time so they stopped many times between the west and east coasts, often landing in pasture or farmland. They were quite a hit with the locals. He moved to Seattle in 1972 as sales manager for Seattle Flight Service, another Piper dealer, and in 1974 joined Piper's Corpac group with exclusive sales for prop jet aircraft, flying and selling Cheyenne Piper Jets, Fairchild's Merlin prop jets, and other corporate aircraft. He would demo corporate jets for clients in the Northwest and Alaska area, including many tech giants such as Bill Gates. He sold a prop jet to the eskimos in Point Barrow, Alaska. In 1978, they sold their home and moved aboard a 45' ketch and set sail for San Francisco. They were going to sail the "milk route" down to San Diego, the Galapagos Islands, then to Tahiti, Hawaii and the Pacific Rim. They only made it to San Diego, but had a grand time. They did, however, fly to Tahiti and sailed through the islands, spending time on Bora Bora. When his company needed him to sell an airplane, he was able to arrange for a pilot to pick him up at his boat, and he would fly out to meet the client. He retired in 2000.@1878, 1875 @CEB, LMB

In 1919, Ralph married Helen Anna Peterson.®1596 She moved in with Albro and his mother. Helen was an assistant foreman at a pasta factory and Ralph was a caretaker at a public bath.®1331 By 1930, Ralph had become an inspector with the Chicago Health Department and Helen was not working. They rented their home at 5600 S. Sagamon and had a radio. His mother, Jennie, no longer lived with them as she had returned to Owego, Tioga County, New York to live with daughter Fannie Hauver.®1332 In 1940, Ralph reported an income of \$2,300 year plus other sources. He was still a food inspector and they rented the same house. He had finished two years of high school, but Helen had only an eighth grade education. Her parents were born in Germany. She was not working.®1601 Ralph and Helen had no children.®1332

Census shows Earl married to Lorene Lemmon and living with her parents George and Mary in Chicago's Ward 7.®1315 By 1920 Earl and Lorene had their own home in Ward 32 at 10051 Wood St. and Earl worked for the City Treasurer as a paying teller. They had two children, Mary 7, and Faith 1. Mary's mother lived with them as well as Berent Vois Weiberg, in the 1940 census called a Partner, but whose occupation was a draftsman for the city.®1316 A son, Earl George, Jr., completed the family in 1923. Earl, Sr., had the same job in 1930 and Lorene's mother was still with them.®1317 During much of this time, Earl had completed three years of college and by 1940 had a law degree and was in private practice. They now lived at 10046 S. Wood Street in a house valued at \$6500. Daughter Faith and her husband Edwin Zirbel and child lived with them, also Berent Vois Beiberg, Partner.®1318

Two days before the census taker visited their house, Lorene had died. The Illinois Death Certificate database shows that a death certificate was issued, but no burial location has been found.®1333

Earl remained in Chicago as a self employed lawyer.®780 Thirty years later he died in California. Records about Earl George for the period 1942 to 1972 need to be found.

Fannie and her sister Florence were twins, but they led quite separate lives. Fannie married in 1914, four years after Florence. She and husband Frank "Earl" Hauver lived with his parents until about 1917 when Earl's mother died.®1614 They then moved to Cody, Cherry County, Nebraska where they owned a ranch. Cody is a village in north central Nebraska founded in 1886 when a railroad used the location as a construction camp. In 1920 Cody had a population of 428, a 131% growth over 1910. Earl's father, Frank, clerked at the general store while Earl and Fannie worked the ranch.®1612 Ranching life did not last long. By 1925 the family was back in Owego, Tioga, NY. Earl worked as a machinist, father Frank was a carpenter, and mother-in-law Jennie Bingham had joined them.®1610 That same year Frank died.

During the depression years of the 1930s, they resorted to general farming, renting their home and having no radio.®1613 By 1940 Earl and Richard M. had found job as woodworkers in Windham, Bradford County, PA where they lived with Franklin Finch and Fannie was housekeeper.®1611 Perhaps this is when he began to work for the Stakmore Company. Stakmore was founded in 1922 to make folding tables and chairs from imported rubber wood. Earl worked at Stakmore for several years before he died age 61 in 1947. Fannie lived for another twenty-six years, on her own or with others.

Florence was twenty-one when she married Henry Clair Hay in 1910. Henry usually went by the name Clair. Their family of four living children was complete by 1920. A son had died an infant. They rented a home in Binghamton, Broome County, NY where Clair worked as a solderer in a washing machine company.®1605 In 1922, they rented at 4 Lyon Street and Clair called himself a tinsmith.®1358 Clair then became a wood worker in a chair factory and Florence went to work as a machine operator making kitchen utensils. Oldest son Ellsworth, 18, operated a machine in a shoe factory while the three younger children did not work. Although they rented their home at 177 Gray Street in 1930, they had a radio.®1606 They moved again in 1931 to 4 Sturges Street.®1358 Work opportunities began to improve after 1933 and by 1935 the family had moved to Venette Street in Cortland, Cortland County, NY. where they lived through 1938. Clair was still a wood worker in a chair factory. In 1940, however, they lived at 76 River Street, Florence worked in a tennis shop and son LeRoy, 20 had a job at Wickwire wire mill.®1607 Oldest son Ellsworth had married and remained in Broome County.

After World War II began, Clair went to work for Cortland Line Company and son LeRoy joined the army and was slightly wounded in 1944 in Germany.®1552, 1609

About the time Clair was ready to retire in 1947 a great tragedy struck the family. Oldest son Ellsworth lost control of his car when beginning to pass a truck on Rt. 11 near Blodgett Mills and died under the wheels of a milk tanker truck.®1608

Ella Dawn was named Ella in honor of her mother's mother, but she used Dawn as her first name.

When she was 15 or 16, Dawn went to Orlando, Florida with her mother and her mother's new husband, David Merritt Miller who was in the army. There Dawn met and married Ralph Richard LeVitt. He was a WW II pilot with the 419th Night Fighter Squadron.®1527 He was discharged at the end of the war at the rank of Captain. He must have been transferred to the Pacific theatre as the war with Germany neared conclusion, for in 1944 Dawn lived in Laguna Beach, CA. After the war they had four children. In 1950 they moved to Reno, NV and divorced in 1951.

The same year Dawn married George Lind. He was a pharmacist in Reno. They had a child, then divorced in 1958.

Again, Dawn married right away. Her new husband, Conrad Luis Bergland, in 1960, was a tire recapper in Reno.®1358 They had a child, Conrad Daniel Bergland, who died at 3 months. If he had a twin sister as one source claims, she was not named as a survivor in Dawn's obituary. We do know that in 1974 Dawn and Conrad were granted a permit to build a house in Bouse, AZ, not far from Quartzite in the desert. According to her obituary, "Dawn held a variety of positions in her life, but the ones she enjoyed most were selling antiques and working as the assistant to a District Attorney in California. On retirement, she mapped Native American archaeological sites for the University of Arizona with her husband Conrad. Together, they created the Bouse Fisherman Memorial to protect an ancient, mythic geoglyph in the western Arizona desert. Dawn was also an artist with a life-long love of oil painting."®1527

Dawn died at her Foster Care residence in Ruch, OR near Medford. She was survived by five living children, the four LeVitt children, Richard, Raymond, Connie, and Helen, and her Lind daughter, Laura.®1527

Roland was born in 1944 when his parents lived in McGraw, Cortland County New York so he grew up on the Bingham Homestead dairy farm. When he was 14, the family moved to Punta Gorda, Charlotte County, FL. He married in November 1968, age 24, a woman 14 years older. At the time she went by the name Hilda F. Matheny as she had just divorced Bobby Matheny the same month. Hilda's birth surname was Albritton, and she preferred to call herself Francis Marvina instead of Hilda F. probably in honor of her probable father Marvin F. Albritton. Her mother is unknown.

Marvina (misspelled Marenia on the census) first appears on the 1940 U.S. Census, age 9, living with her grandmother Virginia Albritton in unincorporated Bunker, DeSoto County, FL. Virginia did needlework for the WPA. Next door lived J(ohn) D. Albritton, a son of Virginia's who also worked for the WPA, and his family of wife and five children.®1561 Another son of Virginia's, Marvin F., had died in 1930.®868, 682 The F in his name probably stood for Francis. So putting these meager clues together, the probability that Marvin F. was Francis Marvina's father is quite good. Further, a Marvina Albritton was a sophomore at DeSoto County High School in 1947 and appears in a class picture.®1565

Her marriage record to Bobby Matheny apparently is not among the recorded Florida records online so we don't have a date for her first marriage, but it was probably between 1947 and 1952 when her grandmother, Virginia, died and was buried in Lily, Hardee, FL.®682 If so, Marvina would have been married to Bobby Matheny for about 20 years before they divorced in 1968.

We don't know when Roland and Marvina moved to Arcadia, but both are buried in the Joshua Creek Cemetery in Arcadia. Roland's parents, Charles W. and Christine are also buried there.

It is interesting to note that Arcadia, DeSoto County, FL was home to the Embry-Riddle Aeronautical Institute, a flight and aircraft mechanics training facility, now a world wide university.

Marvina's grandmother, Virginia, had a challenging life. She was born Early Virginia Bryant in Florida in 1880. She married first, age 19, Noah Franklin Albritton and had at least five children before Noah died before 1930. She married second Roman H. Helton, but did not always live with him so she appears in different places in the various Florida state and US census years.
